


NEIGHBORHOOD ALERT



Stonestown EXPANSION !

Corporations are looking for the GREEN, most neighbors are waving the cautionary YELLOW, and traffic is running the RED! Emotions are running high.

Since the 1986 Stonestown expansion Environmental Impact Report (EIR), plans have changed, San Francisco State University has followed its growth curve, YMCA has grown, Nineteenth Avenue and Lake Merced Boulevard traffic has increased, and traffic safety concerns have reached critical levels! This range of concerns has not mentioned the increasing loss of **human scale** on the streets and sidewalks of this neighborhood.

It is the Editor's opinion (not necessarily that of the ITHA Board) that a project like the **Stonestown expansion** should NOT be approved - or rejected - without a clearly evaluated study of all the relevant impacts on the neighborhood. Such a study (an EIR) should consider pedestrians, bicycles, motorized vehicles, and public transit service in the area - and this is just the transportation element!

You can write and visit the S. F. Planning Commission at 1660 Mission Street, San Francisco, CA 94103 to express your thoughts and feelings; neighborhood shopping vs. mega-malls? traffic safety vs. traffic congestion? reading and home crafts vs. driving and movies?

You decide ... and let your concerns be known! Time is running short.

IMAGSINENARIO...

The Giants make it to the World Series and you are lucky enough to get one ticket for the first game. Too bad that your wife can't join you but she is pleased to be able to watch it on TV with the kids, no hard feelings.

Just as the first pitch is thrown, an earthquake of 7.3 on the Richter Scale hits San Francisco. You are OK and able to leave 3ComPark safely and you listen to the news on your radio while waiting to exit the parking lot. Fires have been reported all over the city, including Ingleside Terraces. With horror, you hear a report of fire and severe damage right on your block.

When you finally reach the Terraces and get through the congestion, you find your wife and children at the improvised shelter, your home is destroyed.

Your wife tells you that after the quake she could smell the gas which sparked the fire but she didn't know how to turn off the gas. In fact, she didn't know where the shut off valve was located. Come to think of it, you aren't sure of its location either.

This is a reasonably accurate account based on a friend's experience in the Marina at the time of the '89 quake. We can imagine many other scenarios - houses falling off their foundations, brick structures crumbling, family members trapped under fallen cabinets, power lines downed on the property, etc.

If any of this sounds worrisome to you, sign up immediately for the Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) training being offered by the Fire Department at Commodore Sloat School beginning October 27, 1997 at 6:30 p.m.

You will learn how to **prevent** certain damage and how to manage emergency situations. Many of your neighbors have taken this valuable training but there are not enough of us to adequately assist all of the Terraces residents when the next disaster occurs. By taking the training **you** will know what to do to protect yourself and your family as well as what you can do to help your neighbors.

Did the quake in the City of St. Francis of Assisi, Italy, make you think about your own city? There are a few of your immediate neighbors who have taken the class training for the Neighborhood Emergency Responce Team (NERT). Do you know who they are and how to reach them with any concerns about preparations?

DRILL

You can see the team practicing skills and conducting HAM radio message relays at the next drill on Saturday, October 18, from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. Come see the team in action.

Also, sign up for the next NERT class series starting October 27, at 6:30 p.m. at nearby Commodore Sloat School. The classes run for a total of six sessions and you achieve qualified status as a NERT to assist neighbors during the next earthquake.

On Sunday, September 28, a NERT review meeting was held in the home of Betty and Barney Johnson and attended by 10 of the 24 local NERT members. A comprehensive review of home safety and emergency procedures was conducted. We expect to see all 24 members at the October 18th drill!
