DISASTER REGISTRY PROGRAM

As many of you know from receiving and reading the NERT Newsletter, and our own SUNDIAL, there is a serious effort underway to register our neighbors who might need extra help in case of a citywide emergency.

The City, through the Department of Public Health has established a confidential Disaster Registry Program (DRP) to locate and assist persons who would be vulnerable in the event of a disaster, specifically, persons over 60 years of age and those with disabilities. The program is free, it's confidential, and is community based.

Your Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) is now organized to assist in the implementation of this program. In a disaster, NERT members will fan out into our neighborhood to check on persons on the DRP list.

If you would need help in case of a disaster such as an earthquake OR if you know someone on your block who might need help, please call *Alice Wallace*, our Disaster Registry representative for Ingleside Terraces, at 587-7203. Alice has lived in the neighborhood for 36 years. She lives at 80 Borica Street and would welcome your participation.

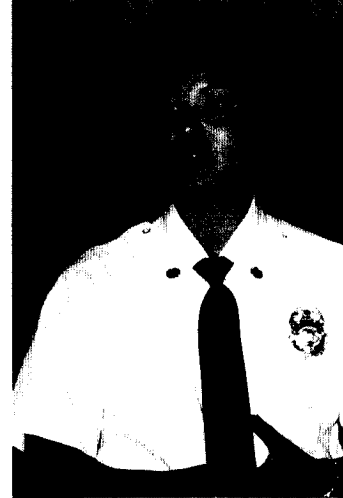

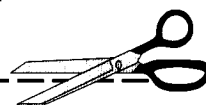
