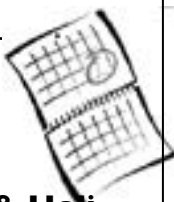

Fall Landscape Day / SF Beautiful Grant Award

Fall Landscape Day (11/4) was a measurable success thanks to the efforts of John, Thom, Robert, Olin, Carole, Carissa and Donna. Graffiti was removed from the Sundial. A bench was repaired, the park urns were weeded, and some progress was made to remove spent vegetation and make room for new plants. Some painting will follow as Halloween revelers did do some damage. Part of the team then moved up to the oval at the portal entrance on Mercedes at Junipero Serra where new plants and more mulch was added. Thanks to all who regularly water over there.

A \$3,200 grant from SF Beautiful for the purchase of cleaning equipment, safety equipment, mulch, plants, and paint has been awarded to ITHA. Once received, these funds will enable beautification work to continue in 3 phases - taking place primarily on Urbano Drive and extending to other areas as time and manpower permits. The goal would be to equip 4 teams of 4 volunteers- each ready to activate and move the plan forward.

Annual Neighborhood Holiday Turkey Drive Continues

Local resident and outreach volunteer, Pierre Smit, began collecting Turkeys for St. Anthony Dining Room out of his home in 2012. Each year participation has continued to grow; over the last three years alone, contributions of cash, online donations, and drop-off donations of hams, turkeys and boxes of fresh produce provided enough food to prepare over 160,000 meals for the hungry locally. This year the San Francisco-Marin Food Bank has stepped in to process donations, 100% of which provide food to needy individuals, families and low income seniors in San Francisco. As in past years, the parking lot at St. Emydius Church (350 De Montford at Jules), just one block off Ocean Avenue, is the collection point for the Christmas Drive on Saturday, December 16, from 9am to noon. Volunteers will be present to receive your donations and offer donation receipts.
